## Music Incursion Information 2015

- ♪ Kids 'n' Music Incursions are now available. One of our fun team members will come to you and run a music session with you and your children
- ♪ Sessions include singing, percussion playing, movement and laughter! All songs have a therapy focus of either...
  - occupational therapy
  - speech therapy
  - physiotherapy
  - kinesiology
  - yoga
- ♪ Our music sessions...
  - 45 minutes (\$165 GST inclusive)
  - 60 minutes (\$220 GST inclusive) (1 x 60 mins OR 2 x 30 mins)
  - 90 minutes (\$330 GST inclusive) (2 x 45 mins OR 3 x 30 mins)
- ♪ A variety of visual and tactile props will be used to engage and motivate your children. Examples include bubbles, streamers, scarves, percussion instruments, squeeze balls, jumping sacks, play dough, scrunchies, Rainbow Rings and Tactile Rings, dolls, brushes, balloons, hand puppets, beanbags etc. We also provide a variety of fine motor and gross motor activities in our music session
- ♪ Children may be grouped according to their age (eg. 2-3 years or 4-5 years) Two to three adults is required to help with each session (eg. teachers, education assistants, child care staff, parents or carers) A minimum of approximately 5 children and a maximum of approximately 25 children is preferred to run a session. Children with special needs are welcome and catered for
- ♪ Electricity for our stereo and a large area for movement (preferably carpeted)
- ♪ All Kids 'n' Music Educators have a Working with Children Check
- ♪ Travel expenses may need to be discussed depending on the location of the Incursion. Rural and interstate Music Incursions will need to be discussed individually
